A petition to nominate a candidate for the office of Member of the Board of Education must be filed with the Clerk of the Board of Education no later than Monday, April 22, 2024, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. and must contain at least 25 signatures of qualified voters. VOTER QUALIFICATIONS

A person shall be entitled to vote at any school meeting for the election of school district officers, and upon all other matters which may be brought before such meeting, who is:

- A citizen of the United States
- Eighteen (18) years of age or older
- A resident within the district for a period of thirty (30) days preceding the meeting at which he/she offers to vote
- No person shall have the right to register for, or vote, at any school meeting or election who
 would not be qualified to register for or vote at an election in accordance with the provisions of
 Section 5-106 of the Election Law. (This includes convicted felons and those adjudged
 mentally incompetent by a court)

PROPOSITIONS

2024 - 2025 Budget

Shall the Board of Education of the Tioga Central School District, in the County of Tioga, New York, be and hereby is authorized to expend sums set forth in the General Fund Appropriations in the amount of \$23,993,367 and to levy the necessary tax therefore.

School Bus Purchase

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Tioga Central School District, Tioga County, New York, is hereby authorized to purchase school buses, including original equipment and incidental expenses in connection therewith, at a maximum estimated cost of \$375,000, and said amount or so much as is necessary shall be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of said School District and collected in annual installments as provided by Section 416 of the Education Law; and, in anticipation of such tax, obligations of said School District shall be issued.

Please note:

The district has applied for both Federal and State grants that may impact the district's bus purchase plan. This information is outlined immediately following the budget document.

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


TIOGA CSD - NEW YORK STATE REPORT CARD [2022 - 23]

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Percent Scoring at Levels for All Students





ANNUAL REGENTS EXAMINATION IN ELA (2022-23)





Due to COVID-19 and changes to New York State testing requirements, Regents examinations in June 2020 through January 2022 were canceled, with the exception of the June 2021 Regents Examinations in ELA, Algebra I, Living Environment, and Physical Setting/Earth Science. The U.S. History & Government examination from June 2022 through January 2023 was also canceled.
